## Game Assignment policy

### 1. You must be in good standing with the DVSRA to be granted game assignments including

- Completing all training requirements and be certified for the current season
- Maintaining a professional demeanor and appearance
- Being current on all dues and fees to DVSRA
- Communicating availability and blocks (via arbiter, email, phone call or text)

### 2. How assignments are determined

- Performance and Fitness for the level of matches
- The number of referees available and the amount of games. These numbers vary from weekend to weekend. More referees available mean less assignments and less referees means more.
- Availability- flexibility in your schedule will maximize your chances to receive more assignments.
- If you have family members associated with a team (son/daughter playing or brother/sister coaching etc.), our policy is not to assign you to avoid controversy (If possible).
- Quality of performances. We are providing a professional service to the soccer community, constant assessing and re-assessing the referee's ability can be used to determine assignments as well as knowledge of new/current laws and local rules of competition.
- Game Cancellations are beyond our control. In the event of a game cancellation, the Assignor and the President shall receive notice by email or phone call to determine if you are owed game fees.

### 3. Events that can reduce or eliminate assignments

- Consistently arriving late or right at game time
- Missing game assignments
- Not willing to accept all positions and game levels (referee, assistant referee, 1 man)
- Continually declining games or not accepting them in a timely manner.

### 4. The DVSRA board reserves the right to decide not to assign any members who do not remain in good standing. Any member who is deemed to not be in good standing by the Board, will not be due a refund of membership fees (unless they have not officiated a game).

### 5. The DVSRA's commitment to transparency will be that the full assignment schedule will be available to view by the Assignor and the President. If you have issues or concerns regarding your assignments, you can contact the Board member of choice for your comfort and convenience.
